We are an established preschool that has served thousands of families the Renton/Kent/Maple Valley area for over forty years. Our excellent teaching staff is experienced and highly trained in caring for the needs of young children. Teachers utilize innovative methods to capitalize on a child's natural curiosity, imagination, and creativity. We use age appropriate challenges to develop each child's talents and abilities. Children will be acquiring skills they will need in the years ahead. We expect children to enjoy being kids—playing, learning, and laughing. We believe that play is the work of a child and activities that appear to be merely play to adults are very important to a child's development. With these goals in mind, an emphasis is placed on children's emotional, social, cognitive and physical growth. Since each child is uniquely different, we encourage them where they are at developmentally. Each child will be assisted to reach their full potential. We count it a privilege to be entrusted with your children.

Discipline

Our discipline policy is designed to help children learn to develop self control. We want children to learn respect for others and learn how to express themselves using words. Children also will learn to take responsibility for their actions and understand that there are consequences to actions. We use a positive approach to help and guide children through redirection, distraction, and positive reinforcement. Teachers establish clear limits on appropriate behavior and continually look for good behavior to praise. No corporal punishment, threats, humiliating or harsh words will be used. If a child is unable to control him/herself, the child will be asked to sit in a quiet area away from others and calm themselves. When possible, the teachers will allow the child to decide when they are ready to enter back into cooperative play.

Curriculum

To keep our lessons interesting and varied, we have "Weekly Themes" that tie into all areas of learning. We will also have several "Focus letters & numbers" each week. Teachers will present these in the following areas below:

- Socialization: Opportunities for parallel and cooperative play. Children will learn to use their words and to problem solve.
- Practical Life: Helping children to master their environment with minimal help - such as pouring, buttoning, cleaning up and washing own hands.
- Dramatic Play: Children love to use their imagination and mimic life in our home and dress up center.
- Sensorial: Helping children learn to use their senses for observation, comparison, and classification.
- Math: Opportunities for children to rote count, use number recognition, and associate abstract with reality.
- Science: Experiences in nature and natural laws.
- Language: Opportunities for children practice letter recognition, phonics, and to form words by combining sounds.
- Spiritual: Christian principles shared through Bible stories, puppet stories, life stories and teacher example.
- Music: Experiences with musical instruments, rhythm, and singing simple songs.
- Arts and Crafts: Projects and open-ended activities using a variety of mediums, where Individual creativity is strongly encouraged.
- Physical: Experiences to foster development in balance and coordination.

Tuition

A non-refundable registration and supply fee of \$100.00 is due at the time of registration. Tuition is figured on the cost of running FCP for an entire school year and divided into nine (9) equal monthly payments as follows:

September tuition is due on August 1st. Thereafter, tuition due on or before the first (1st) of each month. Payments received after the 7th of the month will incur a \$15.00 late fee. Accepted types of payment for tuition are check, money order, cash, and automatic withdrawal. PayPal will be accepted with a \$5.00 convenience fee. Cards will not be accepted for whole year tuition payment. Returned checks (NSF) will be surcharged a \$35.00 fee.

Late Pick Up Fee—It is expected to pick up children at 11:30am for morning class or 3pm for afternoon class. There is an **overtime charge** of \$15.00 for each **10 minutes or portion thereof, beginning 10 minutes** after class has ended.

The school's budget and teachers' salaries are based upon full enrollment, therefore compensation cannot be given for absences. Parents are responsible for each month's tuition in spite of absences, vacations, or holidays.

Arrival and Pick-up Procedures

Children must be checked in and out daily **by an adult** using our computer check in system in each classroom. Children should never be left unattended in parking lot, cars or on the school grounds.

No one under the age of 18 years may pick up a child from preschool at any time. Children will only be released to those who's name appear on the pick up consent form. Parents need to inform FCP office of any changes in address, phone number or emergency information.

Please telephone if you will be delayed in picking up your child from preschool. Classroom doors will be locked until school begins and will remain locked while class is in session.

Health Policies

Our goal is to maintain the best possible health conditions for children. If a child comes to school when he/she is not feeling well, he/she will be more vulnerable to infection. Children may ask to come to school even though they are ill. Please adhere to the following policies. If a child comes to school when ill, they will be sent home.

1. If a child shows signs or symptoms of illness such as sore throat, fever, stomachache, unknown rash, pink or itchy eyes, or a persistent cough, please keep them at home.
2. After a fever a child's temperature must be normal (98.6) for 24 hours BEFORE returning to school.
3. If a child contracts a highly contagious condition such as pink eye, chicken pox, fifth disease, head lice etc., they must stay at home until they have been treated by a physician and are no longer contagious.
4. If a child becomes ill while at school, you will be called to pick up the child immediately. We do not have the space or staff to quarantine children. FCP staff will not call unless the child needs to be at home.
5. If a child is well enough to come to school we will expect him/her to participate in all activities, such as playing outdoors with the class, weather permitting. No medication will be administered by a teacher or staff member except EpiPens if needed.

Infectious Disease

Children afflicted with infectious disease shall be excluded from FCP. When the child is no longer contagious, a physician's note to that effect may be requested by the director, if there are concerns on the part of FCP staff. The child may then be re-admitted.

Please Report infectious conditions to the FCP office in order to warn other parents to watch for similar symptoms.

Immunizations

Children enrolled in Fairwood Christian Preschool must be current on immunizations. Copy of immunizations is required at time of application.

Exceptions are permitted with a signed waiver, and an understanding that parents may be asked to remove child from school if there is an outbreak of a vaccine-preventable disease. The child would be excluded from school until the outbreak is over

Show and Tell

Children are encouraged to share about themselves, family and friends with photos, toys, a stuffed animal, collections, trophies, and things found in nature. Show and Tell is scheduled one time per month and posted in the monthly newsletter.

Toy weapons such as guns, swords or toys that teachers feel could hurt another child are not allowed! They will be taken away and put aside until dismissal.

Help your child to learn to leave these toys at home! Thank you for your cooperation.

Preschool Apparel

Preschool activities are often messy and children should not have to be concerned with staying clean. Please dress your kids for play. Shoes with slick soles, flip flops and skirts or dresses without leggings are discouraged. They interfere with running and climbing. Hang up coats, hats, scarves and back packs on the coat racks upon arrival and take home such items at the end of each day. Unmarked clothing left for extended periods will be donated to a local charity. Also, please leave umbrellas at home or in car.

Be sure that your child's clothing is:

Comfortable, washable, and allows for self-dressing.

Appropriate for arts and crafts.

Jackets and backpacks are marked with child's first and last name.

Clothes are warm enough for outdoor play.

Snacks

Each child is scheduled to provide a snack that's low in sugar one time a month on a rotational basis. A snack calendar will be published with the monthly news letter. If your child is ill or not at school on the assigned day please bring a non-perishable replacement snack to be used at another time.

Birthdays are important and children love to celebrate. When your child's birthday falls during the school year, they will be assigned to bring snack on or near that day. They may bring cupcakes, ice cream or other "fun" food on that day. For the children who have summer birthdays, they will be scheduled sometime during the year to celebrate their un-birthday.

A peanut allergy can be life threatening. Over the past few years we have seen increased numbers of children who have peanut allergies. For these reasons we have opted to have peanut free classrooms.

Please help us to maintain a safe environment by keeping all peanuts or peanut butter at home. Students with any food allergies must still notify us on the student registration forms. Teachers will check ingredient lists from packages before serving snacks for those students. Parents of kids with allergies should provide a back up snack in the event a snack is brought their child can't eat.

Field Trips

Fairwood Christian Preschool takes several field trips during the school year. The cost of the field trips, if any, is not included in the monthly tuition. A parent must attend all field trips with their child, or send an adult in their place. In the event that isn't possible the child must stay home from school on that day.

Fundraisers

Our school sponsors several fundraisers each year to help keep our classrooms updated. Fundraisers may be held several times each school year, and parent participation is encouraged.

Some families prefer to make a one time payment of \$100.00 and choose not participate in the fundraisers. Tax receipts will be issued for cash donations, upon request.

Bad Weather Instructions

When snow, ice, or other emergency conditions exist—Fairwood Christian Preschool will follow the Kent District #415 school closure schedule.

Please don't try to judge whether school will be open on how the roads appear to you since the road conditions are evaluated for the entire school district. We have some families and teachers who must travel an extended distance to get to school.

Emergency information will be announced on most television or radio stations.

If the Kent School District opens one (1) hour or two (2) hours late—Fairwood Christian Preschool morning classes will be closed. Afternoon classes will be held.

If the Kent School District is closed— Fairwood Christian Preschool will be closed.

In the event of a power outage, we loose heat and phones in our building.

If an outages that lasts more than 30 minutes—Fairwood Christian Preschool will close.
